14/079 District Councillor Report Broadband

I have been speaking to Michelle Gordon (TDC), BT and Open Reach. There are 3 cabinets in Little Oakley 1, 4 and 7. There are approximately 200 houses from cab 4 – part of Harwich Road and Rectory Road down to

the pond, which get the lowest speeds in the village.

The broadband speeds vary a lot throughout the village.

I have raised concerns with Bernard Jenkin MP about how the BDUK money is allocated.

The Local Plan

Local Plan has not proceeded as expected. TDC have set up a committee with 13 members to look at the Local Plan.

Colchester Borough Council and Essex County Council had concerns about the TDC local plan and objected to it.

Green waste service

This has started in Clacton and is working through the postcodes with us near the end. The cost is

14/071 Broadband (deferred item)

Michelle Gordon (TDC) and Annette Thorpe (BT) spoke to the council about the progress of rural broadband. They said that although the area in Little Oakley that was getting less than 2MB/s (served by Cabinet 4)was not going to be upgraded to superfast broadband, the area served by cabinet 1 (Lodge Road area) would be getting upgraded even though they are already able to receive between 3 and 6 MB/s

Little Oakley parish Council has concerns about the broadband speeds. A few areas of Little Oakley are not too bad. There is however about 200 houses in centre of Little Oakley which gets less than 2 MB/s.
